PSALM 116 A psalm of thanksgiving Showing appreciation for answered prayer

PREPARATION:

Carefully read Psalm 116 seeking to answer these questions about the text:

- 1. What feeling did the psalmist express toward the Lord? (v. 1) Why? What did the psalmist pledge to continue to do? (v. 2)
- 2. In what condition had the psalmist found himself? (v. 3) What did this cause him to do? (v. 4)
- 3. What does he now affirm about the Lord? (v. 5-6) What can his soul now do? (v. 7) Why? (v. 8)
- 4. Consequently what could he now do? (v. 9) What feelings had he expressed during his time of trial? (v. 10-11)
- 5. With what question does the psalmist begin the second section? (v. 12)
- 6. What things did the psalmist pledge to do in response to the Lord's blessing? (v. 13-14) What does each mean?

- 7. What do you think, in view of the context, is the meaning of v. 15? What does the psalmist now affirm that he is? (v. 16)
- 8. What did the psalmist pledge to do in v. 17-19? Where did he want to do these things?
