## PSALM 110 A royal psalm

Affirming the victory of Israel's King

## PREPARATION:

Carefully read Psalm 110 seeking to answer these questions about the text:

- 1. Who is said to speak in this psalm? (v. 1) To whom does He speak? What is the first oracle from God to David's lord? (v. 1)
- 2. Where is David's lord to sit? What is He to accomplish during his reign?
- 3. In verse two the cooperation of God with His anointed is made known how? (v. 2) What decree does God give to him?
- 4. How will the king's people respond to him? (v. 3) How are they described?
- 5. How does the psalmist emphasize the certainty of the second oracle of God to His Anointed? (v. 4) What decree is made to Him?
- 6. This priesthood of the Lord's anointed was to last for how long? What is the significance of a priesthood "after the order of Melchizedek?"
- 7. Where is the Lord positioned in relation to His anointed? (v. 5) What does this assure that He will do? (v. 5b-6)
- 8. In v. 7 the king is pictured as doing what? Then what? What do you think this means?
